The "refugee-migrant crisis"

- 59,5 displaced million persons in the world (UNHCR-2015)
- 20 million refugees, over half of whom are under the age of 18
- Europe is currently experiencing the largest global displacement since WW II
- Sea arrivals in Europe

- 2015: **1,015,078**

- 2016: **362,753**

- 2017: **110,374** (last update

17 July 2017)

The "refugee-migrant crisis" in Greece




- 872,519 arrivals on Greek islands in 2015
- **3,713 arrivals** through land borders in 2015
- **173,450 arrivals** on Greek islands in 2016
- **2,810 arrivals** through land borders (1.1.2016 31.10.2016)
- 20,164 arrivals after the EU-Turkey Statement (April – October 2016) – (18,519 on Greek islands and 1,645 through land borders)
- 10,250 arrivals on Greek islands up to 17 July 2017

The "refugee-migrant crisis" and MdM



- MdM runs 439 programs in > 80 countries
- 15 Chapters run 270 domestic programs (and some also international programs)
- A network of projects in transit and destination European countries, including partnerships with other organizations and public health institutions/medical centers and Search and Rescue operations in Central Mediterranean






The context in Greece

- Currently 62,327 persons stranded in Greece (18/07/2017)
 - 14,133 in the islands
 - 21,861 in accommodation places (apartments, hotels, host families, UASC shelters, etc.)
 - 3,661 in pre-departure/closed centers
 - 8,250 estimated as self-settled
 - 14,422 in 32 open camps in mainland (>50 in the beginning)
- 32.5% children, 21.7%
 women, 45.8% men (as of Jan 2017)








The context in Greece

- Volatile context
- Pre-registration
- Legislation 4368/2016 gaps in practice
- Administrative barriers AMKA number
- Actual access to healthcare facilities
- Victims of violence (including sexual assault and rape → risk of STI)
- $UDM \rightarrow access to health only through$ **Emergency Departments**








- Chlamydia: Syria, M, 27y
- Chlamydia Gonorrhea: 1 couple from Afghanistan, 18-19y
- Genital Herpes: Afghanistan,
 M, 18y Syria, F, 30y
- Gonorrhea: Pakistan, M, 22y –
 Bangladesh, M, 35y
- Syphilis: Pakistan, M, 40y –
 Morocco, F, 33y 1 couple
 from Afghanistan, 24-22y
- Vaginal infection: 163 cases, 21 identified as Candida
- HBV-HCV: 15 cases in M from Pakistan 22-46y – 1 case in F from Syria, 37y






HBV - COUNTRY OF ORIGIN n=59

HBV - AGE BREAKDOWN n=59









HCV - COUNTRY OF ORIGIN n=148

HCV - AGE BREAKDOWN n=148









HIV - COUNTRY OF ORIGIN n=19

HIV - AGE BREAKDOWN n=19









HPV - COUNTRY OF ORIGIN n=18

MdM Greece Response

- SRH is a core axis of MdM interventions
- Provision of services (Holistic approach) Provision of medicines/ appropriate treatment
- Referrals follow up
- Screening at the entry points (!)
- Participation in working groups (HWG, SRHWG, etc.)
- Advocacy
- Training of staff
- Focus on SGBV VoV





MdM Greece Response

- Health Promotion
 - During individual consultations
 - Group sessions
 - Printed material
- Vaccinations (HBV >1600 children vaccinated)
- Condom distribution
- HPV screening
- Harm reduction
 - SNP
 - Condoms







Challenges and the way forward

- Volatile context
- Language barriers
- Administrative barriers in access to secondary health care
- Overwhelmed NHS
- Lack of experience in mass displacement in Greece

- Better and more efficient coordination – information exchange
- Screening for ID STIs
- Ensure appropriate living conditions
- Ensure adequate/timely access to health care for all migrants
- Special focus on prevention services
- Further data collection and research on the impact of STIs on migrant populations health and the risks for public health
